	Standards for the industry - both operational and ethical - to which members will be expected to adhere ensuring that the highest quality of service is provided

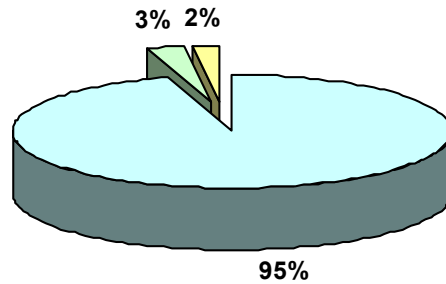

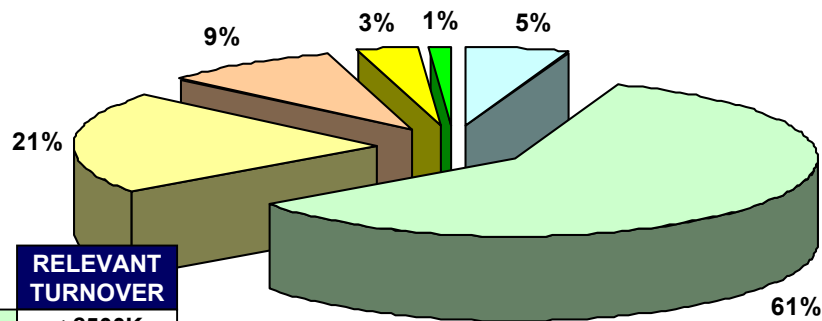

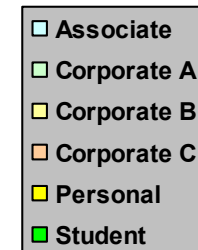

UK Membership Profile

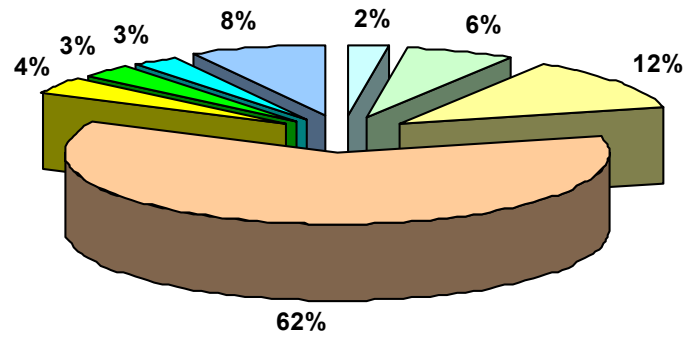

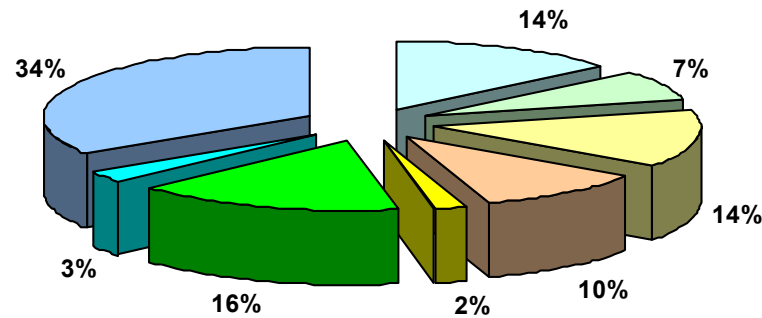

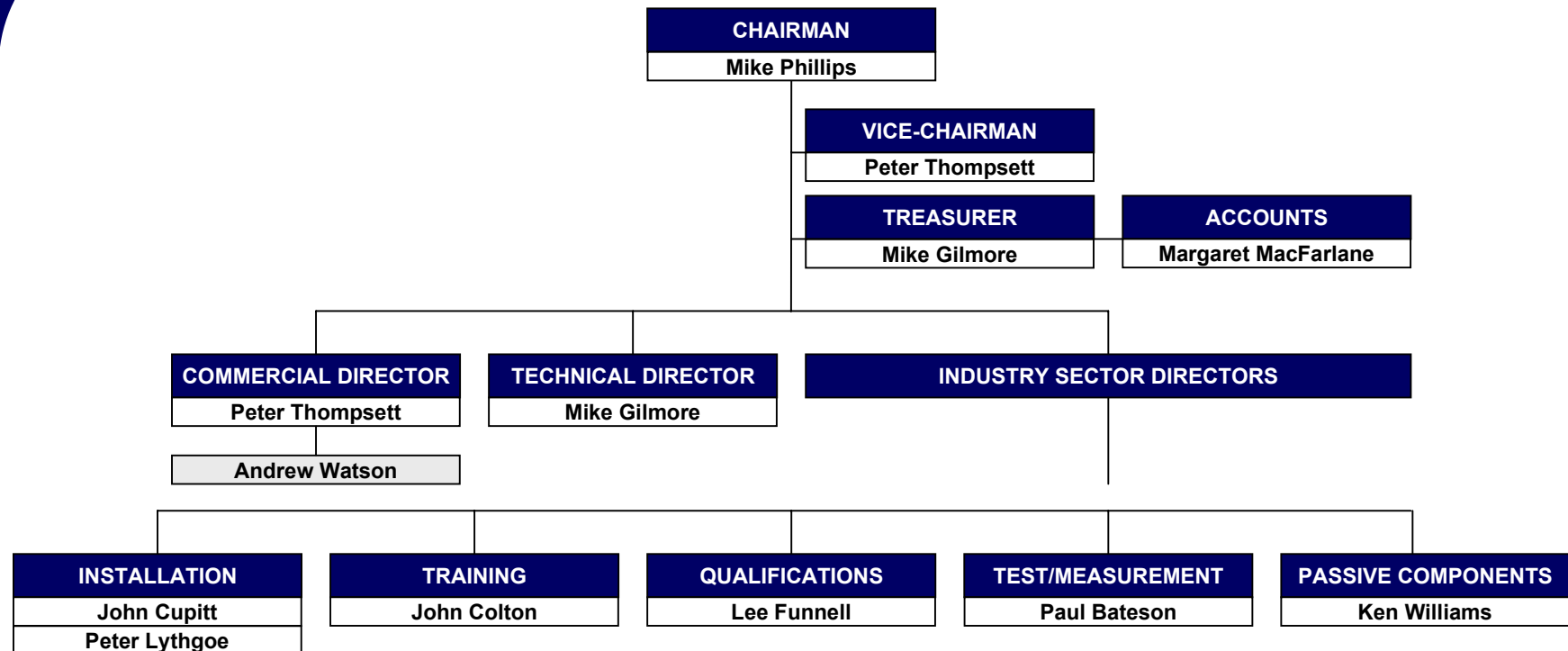
Quoted PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY



Quoted SECONDARY ACTIVITY



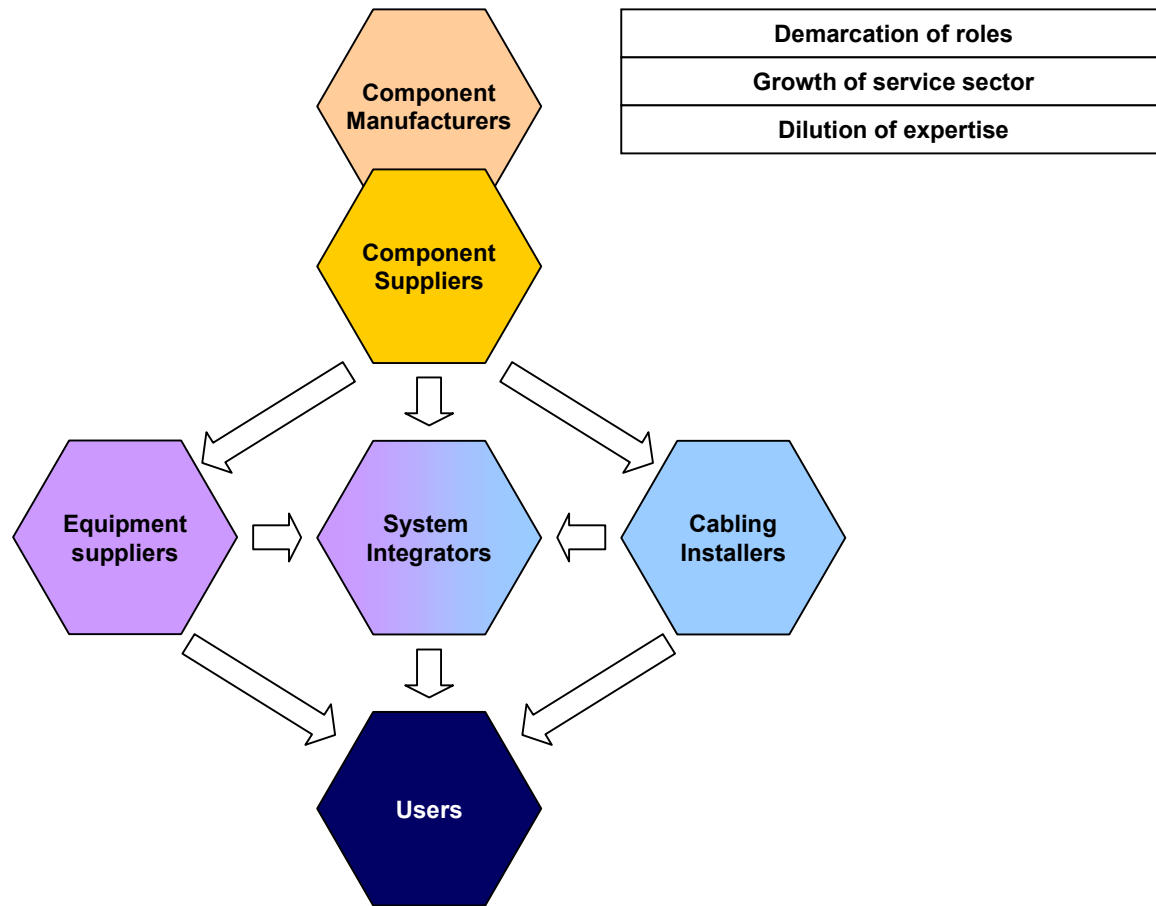

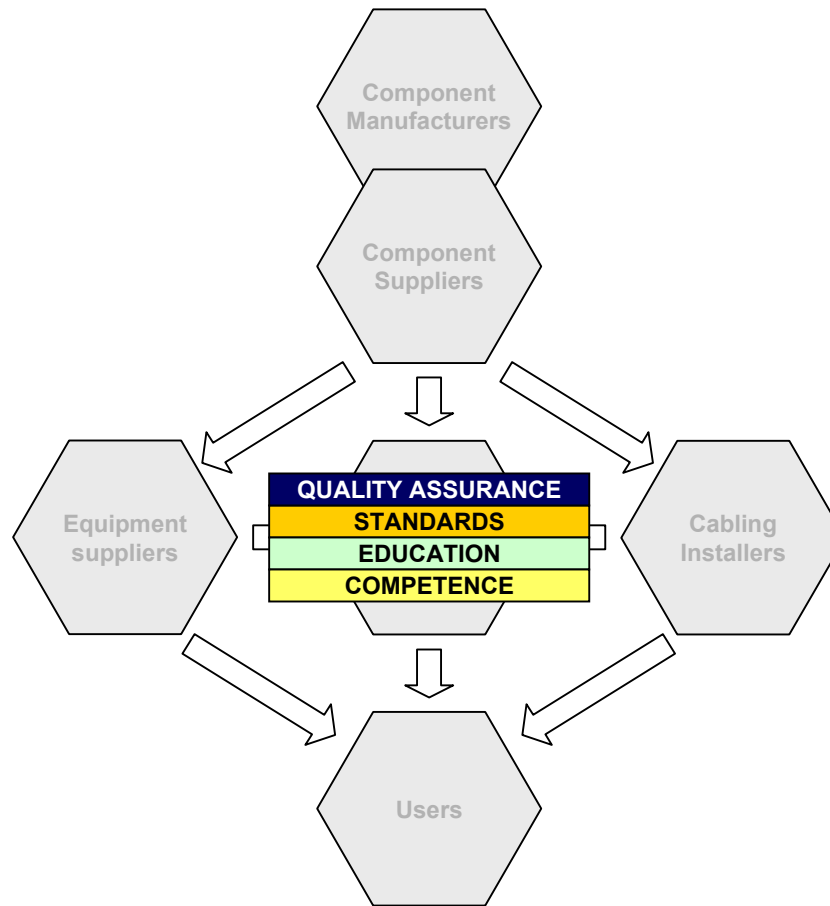

As a part of it is worth pointing out that Roy was instrumental in the promotion of BS 7715 when it was published by the FIA, as an interim step, in 1991. Roy retired at a time when BS 7715 had just been withdrawn and replaced by a much stronger standard - BS 6710:2004 (see inside for details).
